## LOCATIONS

### **Cabrini Hospital Malvern**

A 508-bed acute care hospital offering a wide range of services including coronary care, day procedures, day oncology, emergency care, hospital-in-the-home, intensive care, maternity, paediatric (children's) care, medical imaging and pathology.



### **Cabrini Brighton Hospital**

It has 141 beds across three wards and features a day oncology unit, high dependency unit, endoscopy, sleep centre, onsite medical imaging and pathology, specialist consulting suites and 24-hr medical coverage.



### **Cabrini Residential Aged Care Ashwood**

A 90-bed residential aged care home, which recently celebrated its ten-year anniversary. Residents' wellbeing and quality of life are enhanced by a range of social, recreational, spiritual and emotional support and activities.



### **Cabrini Rehabilitation Service Elsternwick**

Comprising two sites (Hopetoun Street and Glenhuntly Road) and a total of 74 beds. Specialist inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation care is designed to restore patients to the best possible level of function.



### **Cabrini Palliative Care Prahran**

A 22-bed specialist palliative care hospital offering a wide range of services including medical support, nursing, pastoral care, counselling and physiotherapy.



### **Cabrini Linen Service Hawthorn**

This service produces more than 120 tonnes of linen per week and employs some 120 staff representing 30 different cultural groups.



## CABRINI FOUNDATION

The Cabrini Foundation oversees and guides all fundraising activities on behalf of Cabrini Health. As a not-for-profit private healthcare facility, Cabrini Health does not receive direct government funding or financial support from the Catholic Church. Supporting the work of Cabrini Health, the Foundation pursues philanthropic gifts for new projects, education and research and capital funding (equipment and buildings). This work is essential in ensuring that Cabrini can continue to provide a wide range of vital healthcare services for our community. The Cabrini Foundation enjoys strong leadership from a dedicated Foundation Board and commitment from its professional fundraising team.

## CABRINI INSTITUTE

The Cabrini Institute supports research and education activities across the health service, as well as health promotion activities on behalf of Cabrini Health. Senior medical staff and researchers oversee a diverse research program, as well as developments in clinical education. The research program includes arthritis, back pain, cancer, care of the elderly, health literacy, medicine, nursing, patient safety and surgery. The Cabrini Institute also plays a significant role in the education of our young doctors.

Foundation 49 is a men's health initiative that aims to improve the health of all men in the community, by raising men's awareness of their own health and encouraging regular check-ups with their general practitioners.

Let's Beat Bowel Cancer is a health promotion initiative designed to alert Australians to the major risk of bowel cancer.

## SOCIAL OUTREACH

Cabrini Health has a social outreach program that encompasses more than 40 projects throughout Australia and overseas. It is based on strong collaborative community partnerships as an effective way of addressing economic and social disadvantage. Cabrini Health contributes to the relationships through human, financial and material resources and by leveraging our skills, knowledge and services. We seek opportunities to involve Cabrini Health staff, which in turn allows them to make an important contribution to our local community. The program has four areas of focus: serving the most marginalised in our community; community development projects; Aboriginal health and international health projects.
